Who is Christina Green?

My name is Christina "Sarge" Green, and I'm the Administrator for Cathy White, Director of Talent Acquisition and Organization Development and the Process Engineering Organizations here at Electric Boat. I come from a long line of EB employees – my mom was a tin knocker during WWII; my dad a carpenter/painter until the early 1970s; my son, Greg, a five-year employee; and my uncle, Samuel Grills, the longest-serving employee at EB with almost 65 years of service.

I joined Electric Boat in 1986 after serving in the U.S. Army for six years as an Administrative Specialist.
